Directions:

From Denver, take I-25 southbound toward Colorado Springs. Take exit 141 for U.S. West 24. Turn left on U. S. West and Drive 24.6 miles to Divide, CO.. Turn left onto Colorado 67(at the light). Go 3.5 miles to the Ranch on the right.

The address is: 21285 Highway 67, Divide, Co 80814.

The ranch is located in a Rocky Mountain wilderness. The elevation is 9,200 feet. The climate is relatively dry. Given these things please remember to bring clothing that is suited for sunny summer days and cool summer evenings, and in the winter- a lot of snow.

What to Bring Year Round:

Bible, notebook, pen

Bedding (blankets, pillow, sheets for a twin sized bed), all sleeping areas are heated.

A water bottle-drink lots of water to avoid altitude sickness.

A camera- to capture the beauty.

A flashlight, toiletries, towels, slippers (to walk outside the bath house)

Board games, card games, fishing supplies and pole (no license needed)

Clothes, long pants, sweaters (no spaghetti strap tank tops)

Hiking shoes/Tennis Shoes

Medication, glasses, canes.

What to Bring especially for Summer time:

Clothing to dress in layers (pants, sweatshirts for cool evenings)

Sunscreen, sunglasses, bug spray, closed shoes with hard sole.

Light and heavy jacket.

Please DO NOT BRING:

Pets, weapons, fireworks, alcohol, sleds with rails, smoking, work, gasoline or flammable liquids, poisonous substances, illegal substances or RV's (expect approved by JWRR)

General Rules

JWR observes quiet time from 10pm-6am everyday.

Do not litter on the grounds. Put all trash in its place. No gum chewing for kids.

Children MUST be supervised AT ALL TIMES. No slamming doors and running down halls.

Be courteous of others sleeping- close doors quietly and talk quietly.

Park in designated areas only. Speed limit is 5mph.

No valuable items. Watch your items carefully.

WILDLIFE:

Because we're in a wilderness area, it is **IMPERATIVE** that you watch your children **AT ALL TIMES**. The ranch has seen deer, cougars, coyotes, bears etc. Do Not bother the animals and always tell an adult if you see any of these. Please take a whistle with you if you go for a hike and let others know where you are. This is for everyone's safety!

Please Note:

The group is responsible for cleaning the entire facility before departure. There is not enough electricity for cell phones, laptops, or any plugged in appliances. More than 12 items will result in blown fuses and loss of electricity- **CONSERVATION MUST** be practiced. The water is also very limited because of drought, please make all Showers **SHORT**. There are bins available for recycling so please help conserve.
